ITEM: Reset maximum student stipend. (Revised Oct 28, 2014)

UPDATE (Oct 28): NEW for 2015-16: OGS award holders may concurrently hold other merit-based graduate awards up to a combined total of \$10,000. This restriction was not reported in the Oct 17, 2014 draft.

Top-Up Policy: Currently OGS and NSERC scholarships are topped-up by the department (their value is increased) by 11K, except when the total value of all scholarships exceeds the maximum stipend for top-up. In that case, the top-up is reduced until either the student's stipend is equal to the maximum or the top-up is zero.

Several years ago, DCS set the maximum MSc and PhD student stipend to be the minimum salary for an assistant professor at UofT. However we haven't updated that, even though the min faculty salary has increased. Currently the max stipend (for top-up) for a student is 41K.

Proposal 1. Update the max stipend for top-up to 47.6K, which is currently the minimum faculty salary. This would change the amount a winner of the NSERC CGSD receives. See below:

Proposal 2. The department imposes a limit that a student can hold only one government scholarship (i.e., OGS, NSERC or SSHRC) at a time, and these scholarships cannot be held at the same time as any another scholarship valued at strictly more than 20K per year. (Except OGS restricts their award holders to at most an extra 10K in scholarships, starting in 2015-16.)

The idea of avoiding multiple governmental scholarships is to ensure the department spreads these government scholarships around.

Note the BUL scholarship is currently at 20K and can currently be held by students with an NSERC. We are proposing to continue to allow this, although for the BUL the student must argue for financial need.
