#### Qualifications

Strong Python programming and software engineering skills. Experience with programming, such as by completing a 200-level CSC course, or by achieving excellent marks in multiple 100-level CSC courses, or equivalent. Must have experience with Python, including the Python memory model and Python PEP-8 style guide, such as by completing CSC108 or equivalent. Must be enrolled in or have completed a computer science degree, or equivalent. Must have prior experience teaching first-year computer science, such as being a teaching assistant for CSC108/CSC110/CSC111/CSC148. Must be able to typeset using LaTeX.

### **Relevant Criterion**

Previous experience is the more relevant criterion than the need to acquire experience in respect of this posted position.

### Duties

Helping the course instructors prepare midterm and exam questions, solutions, and marking schemes. The TA must be available to meet with their supervisors at a mutually agreed upon time between Monday to Thursday, 9am-4pm Toronto time.
