The Department of Computer Science seeks ~1-2 Regular TA(s) for the following course:

CSC2702HY – Technical Entrepreneurship

Course Description: The MScAc degree is intended to create technical leaders capable of transferring new technologies from academia to industry. This course introduces fundamental concepts from business and management that are relevant to students thinking about starting their own business or bringing new ideas to fruition within existing ones. This course will also equip students with the experience of presenting and defending their scientific research through various research activities and communications.

Note: This is a graduate course offering for the MScAc Program; it is offered during the summer term and we are seeking 1 TA for 120 hours or possibly 2 TAs for 60 hours

Qualifications

The chosen candidate must be familiar via courses and/or start-up experience with most of the following topics: applied industry research, including research lab management; value propositions, use models, IP protection; market sectors/segments; software business and revenue models; product definition; low-fidelity software prototypes; sales/marketing methods, internet marketing; financial forecasting models, financial statements, financing methods; the development of business pitches; business ethics. Must demonstrate maturity and have strong English writing and oral communications/presentation skills. Start-up experience and previous TA experience highly recommended.

Relevant Criterion

Previous experience is the more relevant criterion than the need to acquire experience in respect of this posted position.

Duties

Duties will be attending two 3-hour lectures roughly every 2 weeks and assisting with online attendees, grading short weekly assignments, holding weekly office hours, and consulting with students by email and in person.
