

CSC290: Business Analysis - A

1. You are an owner of a cake shop. You hired a developer to build a website for you. Here are some requirements that you had in mind:

- You would like a gallery of your best cakes.
- You would like to show off testimonials from past clients.
- You would like people to be able to find your shop's address and opening hours.
- You want to be able to post exciting developments, holiday closures, and other news.
- You would like people to be able to order standard cakes online, for either pickup or delivery.
- You would also like people to be able to order custom wedding cakes online. This is a more involved process, and clients should be able to upload either a written or sketch of the cake they want. You need to be able to contact the client.
- You care about allergies, and offer vegan, gluten free, and nut free cakes.

The developer will ask you questions to try and elicit some of these requirements. This is the first time you are meeting the developer, and so this person knows nothing about you or your company. You are not technical, and will rely on the developer to ask questions to understand your requirements. You will hopefully develop a more specific list of requirements than the above during your discussion with the developer.

For this exercise, only answer direct questions.

2. You are a developer, and you have been hired to build a website for a bicycle store. This is the first time you are meeting your client. What question will you ask to figure out as much as you can about the website requirements?
