### Style Guide...

- Here: StarOffice Writer, Home: you can use any text editor (notepad, TextPad, ...)
- Make Backups regularly
- use .html not .htm
- no spaces in file names
- A02FinalCopy.html
  - not "A02 Final Copy.html"
- tags in capital letters
  - <HTML> <B> <P>
  - (but special characters such as © must be lower case)
- <!-- documentation to explain complex instruction groups -->
